Lots of spots and pyjamas around the school today for **Children in Need**. We have raised just over £60, the final amount will be confirmed next week.

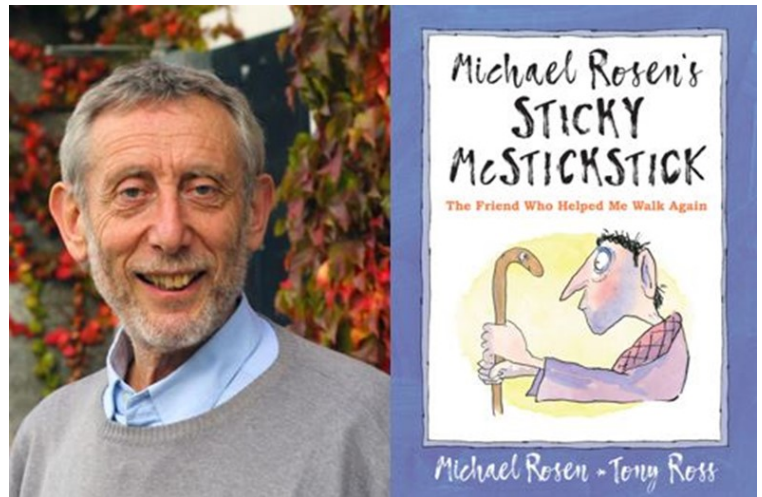


Michael Rosen
