Head Lice Alert




Choughs Class:

Choughs have been talking lots about teddy bears as part of our Old Toys topic. We went on our very own 'bear hunt' around the school: stomping through thick, oozy mud; strimming away some long, wavy grass and jumping up and down in a river pouring down the garden steps. This adventure culminated in us finding an enormous teddy bear hiding in the garden! "We're not going on a bear hunt again!" This inspired us to think about what we'd like to go on a hunt for and we wrote our own versions. We thought carefully about contractions (words like we're, can't, we've). Art Club

Over the past couple of weeks, the children in Art Club have been creating their own patterns based on Jane Hissey's lovely story about Old Bear and friends: 'All-Together Painting'. In the story, the old toys each set about painting their own pictures but they all go wrong: Jolly Giraffe's spots go all runny; Rabbit's stripes go all wavy as he hops and Duck's blue painting gets splatted by Ruff the dog's ball. Little Bear even gets more paint on himself than the paper! Inspired by this beautiful book, we created patterns in the style of the different characters. We are going to use these to create our very own 'all-together painting'. This is what we did:

Right, left, right, right. Left, right, left, left.




A maths problem:

Various members of our class have had a try of a tricky problem. Part of it is below. It uses multiples of 13. Can you find the rule and fill in the gaps?

We took part in a fabulous, online workshop with Aisling Fowler and were able to hear extracts of her new book Fireborn and try out some of the techniques she uses for generating ideas in her writing.

"It was really exciting – I would really like to read Fireborn!!

"It was amazing because the book sounded super interesting and the activities were good as well. It sounds like a really good fantasy book. Aisling Fowler was also really nice."

In **history**, we have considered how the experiences of evacuees differed enormously. We created 100 word videos or information texts and tried to give a balanced view of different experiences.



In **science**, we have experimented with UV reactive beads and considered which kinds of materials would be good for making sunglasses lenses with and why.



make good lenses for sunglasses because they don't let
all the light come through and
they disperse some of the light
so not so much UV will reach
our eyes. Opaque materials
wouldn't work as they let no
light through so you couldn't
see anything! Transparent
wouldn't be good because they
let all the light through so
they wouldn't protect our
eyes."
