In our first Art Club session, Puffins learned about continuous line drawing. We looked at examples drawn by other people, imitated them and then had a go at creating our own. Where in the world is China?

This week, Choughs have been learning about where China is in the world. We used atlases and the globe to locate China and describe where to find it:

"China is in Asia. It is far away from where we live and it is to the south of Russia and to the north of India. China is next to the Pacific Ocean and is near to Mongolia. It is also near Thailand." - **Freya**



Next, we looked at the geography of China itself. We used a giant map of China on the playground to identify key physical and human geographical features like rivers and cities. We walked the Chinese border and discovered that it's a pretty big country! We got wet feet as we walked past the Yangtze River and were really thirsty trekking through the Gobi Desert. We learned that China's geography is very different to our own as there are mountains, deserts and forests of bamboo.
