Health and Safety

Parking – Thank you for supporting us with this whilst we wait for action from the Council. Some parents have taken advantage of pulling into the area in front of the minibus when a member of staff is present. To prevent congestion and cars waiting, this is only for parents who are dropping their children and driving straight off. If you need to come into the playground or catch parents/staff then please park in a safe place. Thank you. **Heating-** We finally have a long-overdue program of work underway to address the heating system in the whole school, in particular Class 2 where it can be cold. In the meantime please make sure your child comes to school with an extra layer such as a fleece. Thank you.

Attendance

You will receive your individual child's attendance report this week with a leaflet attached to aid understanding regarding attendance and percentages. Whilst 90% sounds high, in an attendance context this is a great cause for concern - deemed by the Government as being persistently absent and would be picked up by the Educational Welfare Officer. Our attendance objective is to sustain National Average at 96% for every child. As a small school we need your support in minimising absence in order to meet government targets. We are unable to authorise absence for holidays taken in school time unless there are exceptional circumstances which have been discussed in advance with the Headteacher. As always, we look at each case on an individual basis and take into consideration a number of other factors detailed in our 'Attendance Policy' (available on the website). If you are planning to be absent, please remember to complete an absence request form one month in advance,

3available from the office or on the website. If you are able to book unavoidable medical appointments after school or late afternoon (rather than the morning), this would help keep your child's absence level down.

Pupil Premium

The criteria for claiming free school meals has recently changed and now includes Universal Credit as a qualifying benefit.

If you would like us to check your eligibility for claiming please contact Hayley in the office by Wednesday 17th with your national Insurance number. This is crucial for school funding as the amount for each child is considerable and benefits the school enormously. Your details will be kept confidential.
