It could be a collage, a painting, a photograph, or anything else you can imagine!</p>	<p>Find out some space related facts and write /present a short news report. It could be about black holes, Neil Armstrong or your favourite planet!</p>	<p>Design and build an alien world in a shoe box.</p>
<p><b>All about you</b></p>	<p>If you could take five things with you on a space mission to Mars, what would they be?</p>	<p>Take one photo a day for a week to tell us a bit about you.</p>	<p>What's your favourite colour? Create a collage of things you like that are that colour. E.g. Love yellow? Your collage could feature the sun, butter and bananas.</p>	<p>Make a list of three things you are good at, three things you love, three things you dislike and three things you'd like to get better at.</p>
