
afternoon and gave us all the chance to have a go with some of the beautiful puppets Jonathan has made with school groups in the past. Watch this space for more updates as the project develops!


## **BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK**

On Wednesday 7th March, as part of British Science Week, everyone took part in exciting, scientific activities.
