Sowing, Watering, Recording



Over the past few weeks, Gardening Club have been busy sowing all sorts of different flowers and vegetables. This week, we had a chance to observe the growth of our sunflowers, noting how leggy they had become and how quickly they had grown. As well as this, we planted beetroot and radishes, being careful to sow the seeds thinly in rows.

We have also been having lots of fun identifying unknown plants, using the app "Planty". We have been using the app to not only identify, but also to catalogue and set a watering schedule to hopefully help our plants thrive. From our findings, we intend to make our own Garden Journal, containing illustrations and observations.

Musical Hubbub!

On Thursday, Puffins took a trip to Heartlands to take part in a musical Hubbub organised by Cornwall Music Hub (now known as AS**ONE** Hub). It was a super day filled with different musical activities to try!

Tudor Music: we learnt about different Tudor instruments, heard them played in an ensemble, danced in some fun group Tudor dances and learnt about way of life at the time.









Gamalan: a traditional instrumental ensemble from Indonesia and Bali which incorporates many different instruments including some made from beautiful bronze and some incredible gongs of different sizes. The music is based on 8 beats with the gongs sounding on 1, 5 and 8 which we tried. We also danced traditional dances.







Samba: a style of music and dance originating from Brazil. We played many different instruments including:



African Drumming: we played djembes trying different call and response songs and even tried conducting!















Oobleck and Cloud Slime!

Science Club this week was all about solids and liquids. We revised and learnt the difference between the two, modelled some of the differences in the playground and then asked if it is possible for something to be a solid and a liquid at the same time. We found out that oobleck (a Non-Newtonian fluid) can be and played with some. Finally, we made some cloud slime to play with!
