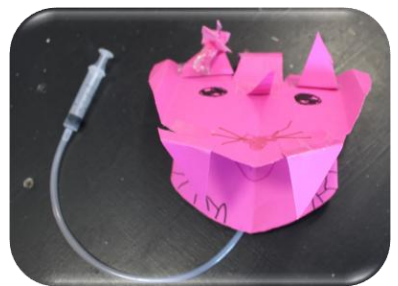
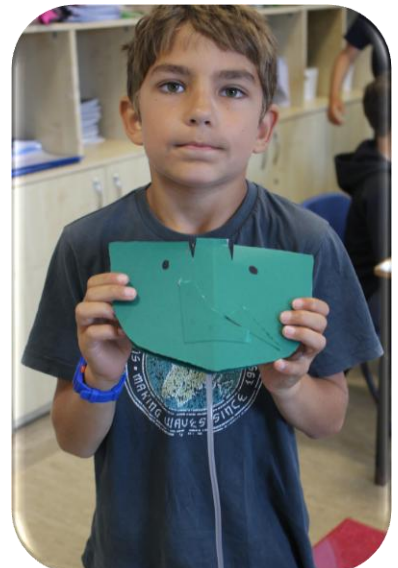
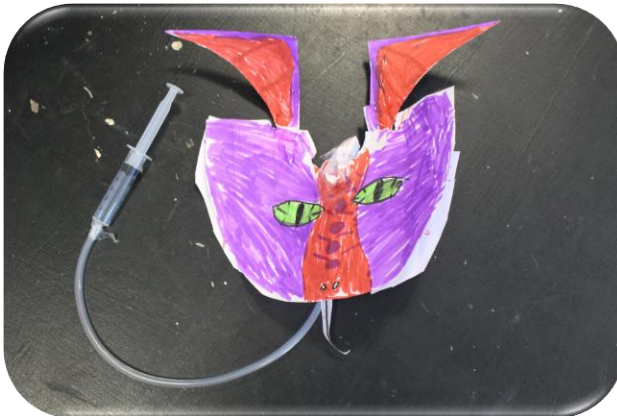
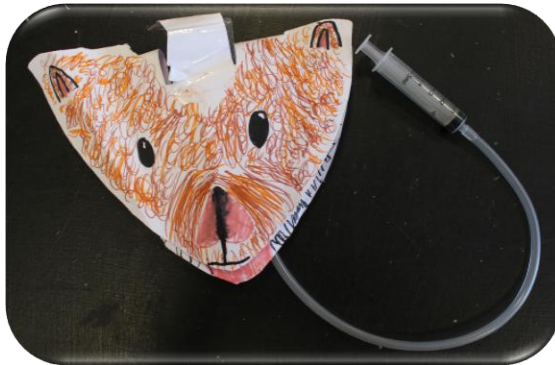


Puffins Put Their Engineering Skills to the Test!

This week, Puffins became engineers as they explored the difference between **hydraulic** and **pneumatic** systems. After investigating how each mechanism works, the children designed and built their own pneumatic machines using syringes and tubing.

Using just card, tubing and two syringes, the children created model animals with mouths that opened and closed using air pressure. Getting the mechanisms working smoothly took patience, careful problem-solving and plenty of perseverance. Puffins showed fantastic resilience, refining their designs and making adjustments until their creations worked successfully.

The finished models are brilliant, and we can't wait to show them off! Come along to our **End of Term Celebration and Year 6 Leavers' Assembly** to see the pneumatic animals in action!



Summer Tree Sketching
