During British Science Week we have enjoyed the following experiments:

- Puffins have been exploring how changing the habitat of organisms effects their growth. They have been encouraging mould to grow on bread in a bag by wiping in on their shoes, on the floor and in the bin! Hopefully, photos to follow although no sign of mould yet!
- Choughs have also explored changing habitats with their emerging sunflowers. The plants that are still in the cold and dark do not seem to be doing very well...
- Do you know the difference between reptiles and amphibians? Choughs have been learning that while both are cold-blooded vertebrates, there are key differences between them - the root of the differences is that amphibians spend part of their lives in water, while reptiles have evolved to live on dry land.




