An Inspiring Visit from Floyd Steadman OBE

Puffins were fortunate to welcome Floyd Steadman OBE to school on Tuesday this week. Floyd shared stories from his childhood, speaking honestly about some of the challenges and difficulties he faced growing up. The children were captivated hearing about how his determination, hard work and resilience helped him overcome these obstacles and achieve success in everything he set his mind to.

Floyd spoke about his career in rugby, education and leadership but perhaps the most powerful part of his visit was his message about kindness. He talked openly about racism he had experienced during his life and encouraged the children to think carefully about how they treat others. His message was simple: everyone deserves respect and the world needs more kindness.

The children listened brilliantly, asked thoughtful questions and came away inspired by Floyd's story. We would like to thank him for taking the time to visit us and for sharing such an important and memorable message and for the generous gift of his book.

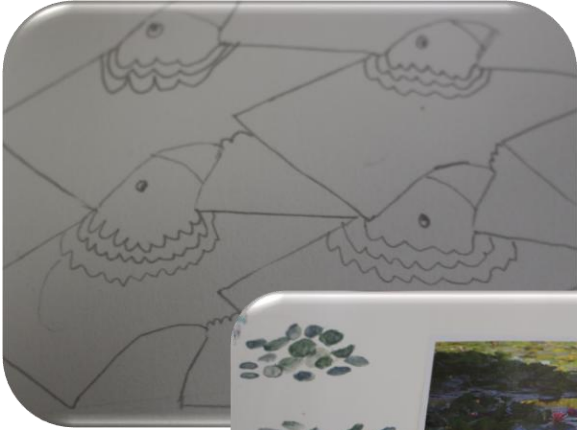


Capturing Movement Through Art

This term, Puffins have been exploring how artists capture movement and bring their work to life. Using a range of different media, including ink, the children experimented with ways of recording the movement of water as it flowed from one bowl to another, carefully observing shape, line and texture.

We also explored the Impressionist movement, learning how artists used colour, light and brushstrokes to capture a single moment in time and make it feel alive. The children studied the work of M. C. Escher and investigated how he created repeating, interlocking patterns that seem to move across the page.

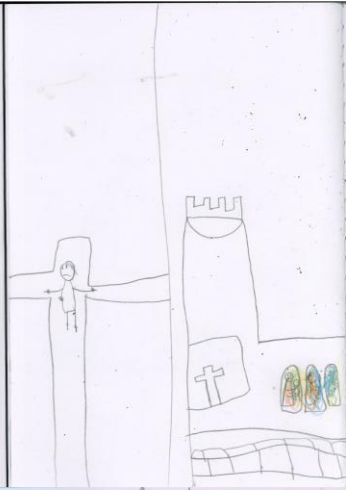

Forest School

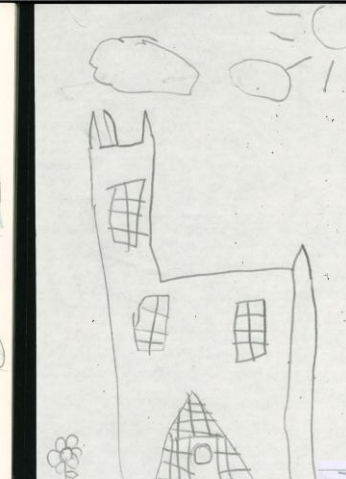
