Dear Parents.





Flexi-schooling research feedback

The research explored how children, parents and staff understand the practice of flexi-schooling at St Levan. Participants were found to be broadly in favour of flexi-schooling yet views were conflicted. At the outset, it was suggested that flexi-schooling provides enriching educational opportunities for children yet potentially impacts upon pupil progress and increases staff workload.

Outcomes of the research

Some emphasised flexi-schooling's potential in providing a more balanced education, particularly for younger pupils or those with SEND, and although positive about our school, many were critical of the wider education system in the UK. Flexi-schooling's ability to provide a more personalised, individual curriculum and pedagogy was evidenced by many responses. It was also felt that flexi-schooling offered a 'USP' which helps attract families to our rural community.

However, the conflicting responses indicated that flexi-schooling is a divisive issue and some felt reticent about sharing their views which stem from deeply rooted assumptions about education and schooling.

Suggested improvements

One aim of the research was to suggest means of improving flexi-schooling but this was challenging as different groups' suggestions conflicted. For instance, some participants suggested having greater freedom of the choice of day whereas others suggested limiting flexi-schooling to just a Friday afternoon. Suggesting any improvements, therefore, required thwarting the aims of one group to appease another! Suggested improvements included:

- Changing terminology to 'flexi-learning' to overcome dominance of 'schooling' discourse
- Maintaining existing hours and age limit
- Promoting flexi-schooling more widely as a USP
- Celebrating flexi-schooling more regularly through e.g. sharing assemblies and pupil focus groups
- Better communication between school and flexi-schooling families
