

This is a picture of the tenor bell (left) compared with an orange so that you can see the size (about 2 o'clock on the picture). This bell, known as 'Solomon', is just over 37 cwt - i.e. the same weight as a large car/small tractor and is the heaviest bell in Cornwall (beating the tenor in Truro cathedral which is only 33 cwt). We hope to hear the bells featured on BBC radio 4 sometime in the new year. We'll keep you posted!
