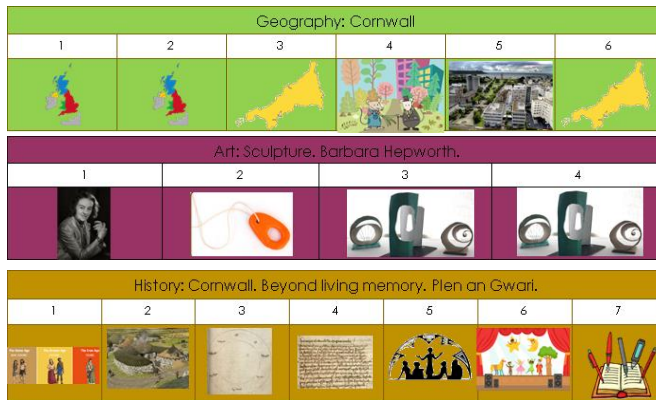

## Cornwall

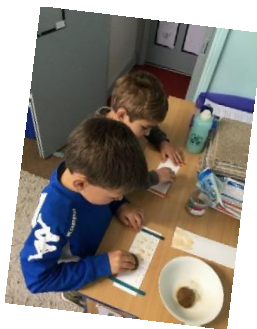
We are all really excited about our new Cornwall topic! Things started off this week with learning about where Cornwall is in the UK and how homes and buildings have changed since the Stone Age. We learned about Cornwall's past by looking at



the landscape and sequenced local landmarks such as the Merry Maidens and Men an Tol into a time line. We then used these ideas in our artist study of Barbara Hepworth to create necklaces out of polymer clay, employing a range of skills such as rolling, moulding and cutting to represent our ideas.



## Judaism



Choughs are continuing to learn about Judaism in RE. We looked at the Torah scroll, and Mezuzah which hold a special Shema prayer. The children thought about their own special words. They reflected on how they can help



others and the environment as well as what they thought was important. They used these ideas to make scrolls of their own.
