Finishing our Henry Moore Sculptures



We covered the wire armatures we had made with paper and tape to achieve the shape we wanted, then dipped Modroc into water and wrapped it around our sculpture. Finally, we smoothed the Modroc to fill in any gaps. Once our figures were dry, we added a layer of PVA glue to seal them.

Pet Day

We had an amazing day with visitors ranging from guinea pigs and dogs to caterpillars and kittens. We learned about how to look after the different animals and shared photos of our pets, past and present, before Cait the vet came to see us. She told us about being a vet and, with some help from Pippin, showed us how to do an examination (minus the temperature check!).



Model Anderson Shelters

Puffins have recently been busy designing and building their own model Anderson shelters. After testing the strength of materials using force meters, they next explored how shape can make a structure stronger. The children were challenged to build a bridge using just a single sheet of paper to span a 10cm gap. Incredibly, the strongest bridge held nearly 2kg! We quickly discovered that a concertina shape was by far the strongest.

Then it was time to put our learning into action. We designed and built our own Anderson shelters using what we had learnt about materials and shapes. However... there was a wartime twist! Because of rationing, we were only allowed to use cardboard - no tape or glue at all. This meant children had to be inventive, creating clever folds, slots and joins to hold their shelters together.

The results were amazing. One shelter held **over 5kg** in testing, showing just how strong thoughtful design can be. Well done, Puffins!
