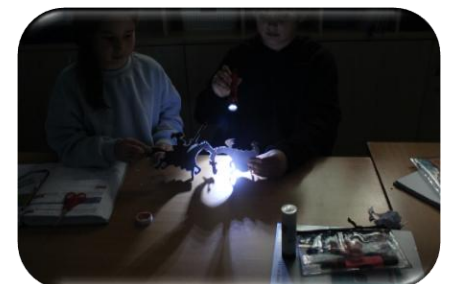
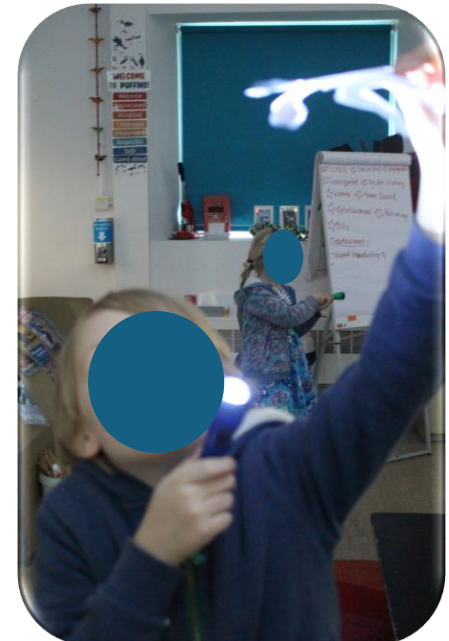
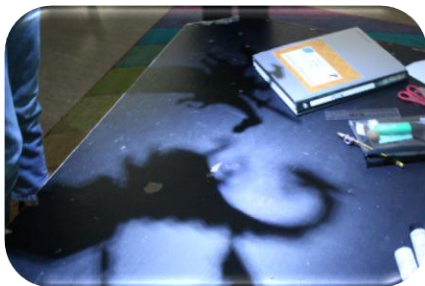
## Puffins Explore Light

Puffins have been investigating how light works this week, using torches, coloured tubes and shadow puppets.

We discovered that **light only travels in straight lines**.

The class tested this using bright pink tubes: when the tubes were straight, the torchlight shone clearly out of the other end but when the tubes were bent, the light could no longer travel through.

We also explored **how shadows change size**. The children worked in teams to create two shadow puppets: a dragon and a knight. Their challenge was to make the dragon's shadow larger than the knight's using only distance and position. Puffins quickly realised that moving the puppet closer to the torch made the shadow grow and moving it away made it shrink.

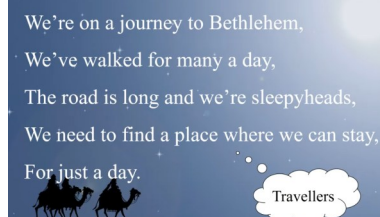


# Acting out the Christmas Story

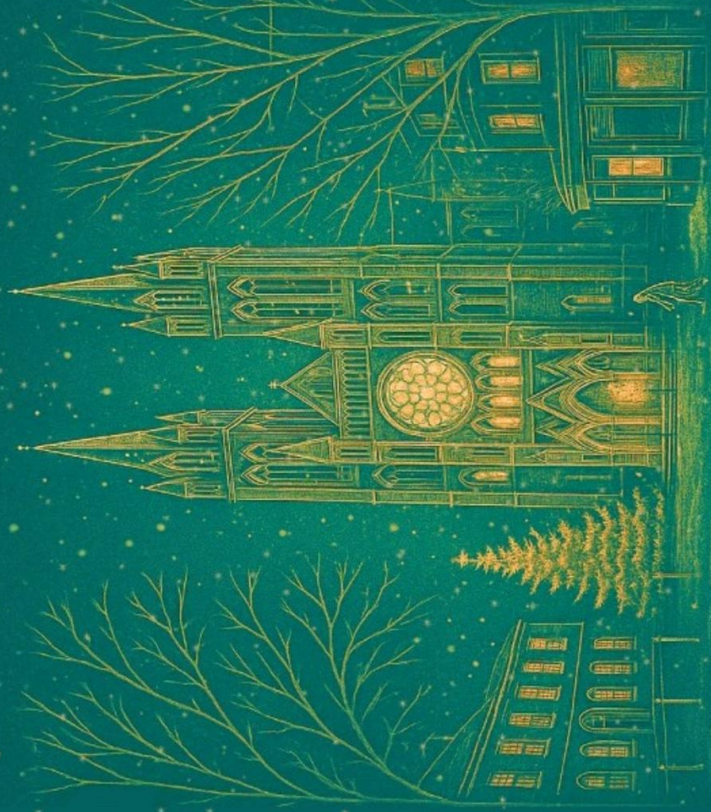
