# Cornwall school appeals panel member – Volunteer

- Would you like to become part of an important, impartial service provided to parents and schools?
- Do you have excellent listening skills, have the ability to put people at ease and make balanced decisions?
- Are you able to offer some of your spare time?

If you have answered yes to the above why not apply to become a **Volunteer School Appeals Panel Member**.

Appeals panel members may sit on panels for two types of hearing.

**Admission appeals panels** hear appeals where parents have been refused a place at their preferred school and wish this to be reviewed by an independent body. These appeals are held remotely and more frequently.

**School exclusion panel members** (Independent Review Panel) consider appeals by parents who wish the decision by a school's governing body, to permanently exclude their child, to be reviewed by an independent body. These appeals are held in person but parents can choose to hold the appeal remotely and are less frequent.

You will work as a Panel of three to consider both sides of a case and be required to reach a fair decision in accordance with government guidance. You will meet representatives from schools; parents and the Local Authority's Admissions Team. Panels are supported by a fully trained and experienced clerk.

## More information on the role

### What will I be doing?

You will be a member of Cornwall's independent appeal panel.

You will ensure that parents and schools feel they have had a fair and independent hearing, have been able to put forward their views and arguments and have been taken seriously.

You will make fair and unbiased decisions as part of a group.

### What skills or experience do I need?

Good interpersonal and communication skills

Good literacy and listening skills

Able to remain firm and calm

Experience of sharing your views and making decisions as part of a group would be advantageous

Integrity

Fairness

### How much time do I need to give?

This can vary depending on the level of commitment you wish to give. There is no formal time commitment. However, panel members commonly sit on panels in the region of once a month during the year and more often during May to July when you may also be asked to attend for more than one consecutive day.

While appeals are held throughout the year, the peak months are between May and July. An appeal date may require a full day, dependent on the number of appeals requested.

### Where will the hearings be held?

The majority of appeals are held virtually via Microsoft Teams (there is no need to install additional software).

### Can anyone be a panel member?

Anyone can be a panel member unless you are a Cornwall Councillor or an employee of Cornwall Council.

### Training

An accredited training session is held in the first part of the year. All panel members must be regularly trained. An informal session is also provided by Cornwall Council's Democratic Services team in the last part of the year.

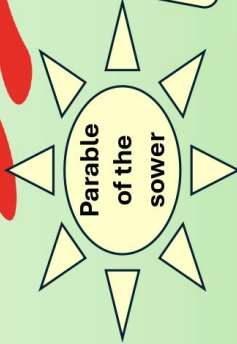
### Do panel members get paid?

Panel members provide a very important volunteer service which is unpaid. However, panel members are entitled to claim travel expenses in line with the Panel members allowances scheme should travelling be required.
