Dear parents,

It is with great sadness that my first newsletter of the year should be one that includes the mournful passing of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, on the 8th of September 2022. The news has come as a great shock to the world and is an unprecedented event in our living memory. I'm sure it will affect many of us in different ways as we begin the period of mourning as a nation that will end with the state funeral.

As a school community we are keen to acknowledge this significant event in order that we might pay our respects and show its gravity in our history. As a school we have spoken with all our children so we can reflect on who the queen was, what she did for the nation and the Commonwealth countries, why this event is so significant, and it is also a chance to discuss our emotions. Our staff have spent time supporting children through open discussion and reflection.

Elizabeth II, who died at age 96, may be best remembered as a leader who provided a model of constancy in a rapidly shifting world. There is a protocol for this period of mourning, and we will uphold the bank holiday on Monday the 19th of September to observe and pay our respects on the official day of the State Funeral of Queen Elizabeth II.

It has been a brilliant start to the new academic year, despite the news; full of variety and splendour! We hope that you all have had a well-deserved break over the summer and are looking forward to the year ahead. As we stated in the letter last week, with your parent survey responses in mind, we are adapting a few aspects of the school to add to our ethos, and we worked out that some children have signed up to nearly 5 – 7 clubs each week, which is so wonderful for children. If you also add the specialist teaching from Cape Cornwall school for Music and Physical Education each week, we have started the year brilliantly!

It was wonderful to welcome everyone back, with a special welcome to Kristupas, Delphine, Felix and Ursula, our new Reception children, and Tia and Jack that have also joined us. We are really looking forward to working with you all as you begin your learning journey at St Levan school.

Thank you to everyone that has brought in a cake this morning to support our literacy day – we have a phenomenal amount to sell! As a fitting conclusion, Flora, in Puffins class, created the following poem at home; she was of course rewarded with a head teacher's award for her devotion to poetry writing and her imagery skills.

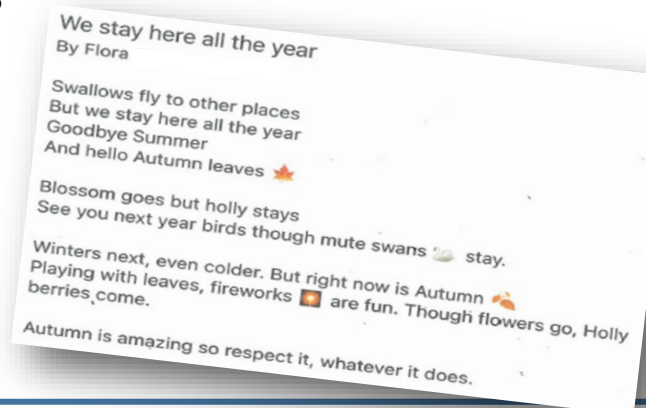

I am feeling sad because the queen died. (AG)

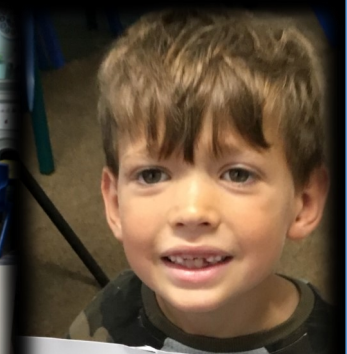
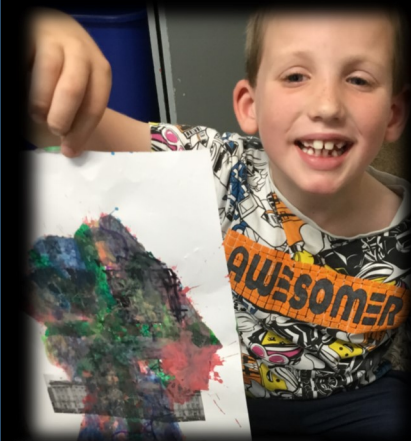
Thank you for being such a lovely queen. (RT)

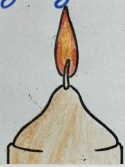


Puffins Class Charter
