Can we make a compass out of a needle?

Puffins have recently learnt about magnets. They have focussed on how they attract and repel and have visualised what a magnetic field looks like using iron filings. On Friday, they were set the challenge of using a magnet in a floating dish to find magnetic north. Once they had achieved this, they could use the magnet to magnetise a needle and make an improvised compass.

At first, the investigation appeared not to be working. However, after trying the needle resting on a leaf it finally pointed north. We now ask ourselves: How long will this magnetism last? The general consensus is that the effects will have worn off by Monday - we will let you know!



Do all magnetic materials conduct electricity?

Most people thought yes. However, after a crash course in creating circuits, the results are in and, based on our investigating, the answer is surprisingly no.

Everyone had such great ideas for future tests involving circuits - we look forward to this learning in the future!



Calvino Nights

The compass theme in Puffins continues this week with our trip to the Minack to see Calvino Nights. The show was certainly spectacular (saxophones billowing 6-foot flames!) but we asked ourselves what the show was all about? The cast talked a good deal about losing their 'moral compass'.

What is that? What were the messages the production was trying to get across to the audience? Here is some of what Puffins thought...

What is a moral compass?

"A metaphorical compass which tells you what is right and wrong. If you lose your moral compass (like they were in the play), you cannot tell what is right and wrong anymore."

What were the themes in Calvino Nights?

"Conflict and peace - I think there were refugees who were not accepted."

"Be kind, be generous, help people, don't be selfish."

What messages were they trying to share?

"That people are doing really bad things and there are a lot of problems in society. We should stand up for what is right and try to make a difference."







Beach Clean
