A huge thank you to Kristupas and family for kindly donating a new suitcase to school for Stan the bear. His old one was looking rather dilapidated!



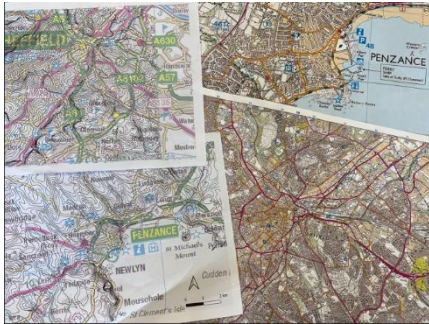

Can you match these up?



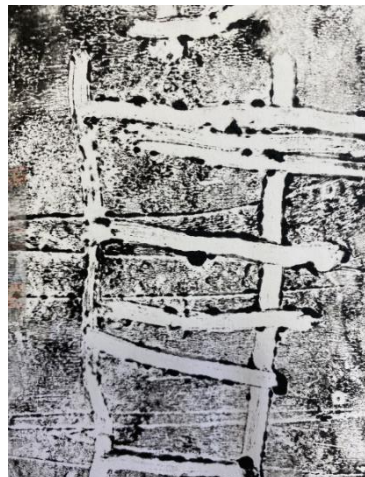
After comparing Sheffield (a coal mining area), with Penzance here is what we learnt:

- Penzance is quite low lying in fact there is one place at -1.7m below sea level!
- Penzance does have some hills but they are quite gradual slopes
- The cliffs around Mousehole are quite steep
- Sheffield has some steep and high hills – up to 300m above sea level!
- Sheffield has a valley (v-shaped like Boscastle!) We can tell because of how the land slopes down and there is a river at the bottom

We are really getting into our book by Polly Ho-Yen. The Boy in the Tower. We quite often ask for, 'Just one more chapter!'



We have been taking inspiration from Syrian artist Kevork Mourad and creating monoprints. Ours have focussed on the tools and machinery of mining.
